

- Appendices C, G, and H are undergoing final review at ASA(CW)






- Comprehensive TPP Guidance being developed.
- Due date is 1 Sept 2022 to ASA(CW).
- Will consolidate policies for TPP and will provide clear programmatic guidance across the board.
- Will be a Real Estate section to deal with those issues that have come up.
- Protection of natural and cultural resources will also be addressed.
- Drafted a policy paper for inclusion of erosion control. Still needs to be briefed to leadership before being include in comprehensive guidance.












### **Supplemental Program**



**Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018:** \$17.4B (signed into law 9 Feb 2018)

**Disaster Relief Act of 2019:** \$3.25B (signed into law 6 Jun 2019)

Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act, 2022: \$17.1B (signed into law 15 Nov 2021)

**Disaster Relief Supplemental Approps Act, 2022**: \$5.7B (signed into law 30 Sep 2021)
