


Lessons learned:



WEBINAR 1:

Background:


- Developed in 2014-2015
- Charge was to develop a course that combined on-demand instruction with facilitated virtual instruction
- Replacement for Planning Principles and Procedures, incorporated elements of other previous PCC courses (environmental, economics, public involvement)
- 8 week online course, 40 hours, mix of self-directed lessons, webinars, and assignments
- Beta session deployed in FY15, 2-3 courses each FY since







Challenges:

- Immediately after deployment, guidance began to change rapidly (esp after FY17)
 - Webinars and assignments could be updated easily, but on-demand lessons were much more difficult
- 8 week instruction period sometime new guidance would come out in the middle of a class












Revamp to address Risk Informed Planning:

- Convened PCC2 team, PCC3 team, and PCX guild in DC in May 2018
- Set objectives between PCC2 and PCC3 for RIP topics to cover
- Initiated development of material and plan to execute
- Biggest change: added multiple new webinars to address RIP, removed pared down ondemand instruction and assignments to accommodate
- Adding content in webinars allows us to respond to changes more rapidly












Training Challenges

- Keeping up with changing guidance
 - e.g. Milestone approvers changed twice in 4 months
- Lack of definitive guidance in some areas
 - e.g. bounding BCRs with uncertainty
- Some confusion around multiple process graphics
 - 6-step, RIP wheel, SMART planning phases / milestones
- Difficult concepts
 - e.g. How much detail is sufficient at different stages?

PLAN FORMULATION & EVALUATION CAPSTONE (PCC 3)



What: 4.5 day PROSPECT in-person course, PCC 1 & 2 prerequisites

Major Concepts: Experiential, interactive, learn by doing and sharing, small groups work as PDT's, risk-informed planning and case study-focused

Major Topics (new RIDM modules in bold red): Risk-informed Planning Process, Risk and Uncertainty, Scoping, POOC's – new techniques, Evidence Gathering, FWOP, Plan Formulation Strategies, Evaluation Criteria, Plan Selection, TSP Risk Assessment, RIDM Tools, Study Process & Milestones, Developing a Placemat

When/where: 2-3 times per year, located at District office with nearby case study or field trip sites

Who:

<u>Instructors</u>: from HQ, District Planning Chiefs, SMEs, RTSs Students: Targeted to any PDT members (not just Planning) with 3-5 years experience

Entire week is basically 1 rapid iteration of the planning process!





Developing plan formulation strategies & management measures for case studies - *NEW* techniques!

Developing decision/evaluation criteria for case studies

Developing decision management plan & risk register using IWR-APT





CAPSTONE – SPECIFIC RIDM ACTIVITIES (CONT'D)



Plan selection exercise

TSP qualitative risk assessment (study, implementation, outcome risks) NEW!

Developing Placemats for case studies (senior leaders briefing)

- Bringing together rationale for TSP
- Emphasis on risk story-telling NEW!
- Presentation by all group members
- Essential to course credit

Other elements

- Morning reviews are interactive games
- Family Feud & Kahoots reinforce lecture materials
- NEPA w/ exercise
- Feasibility level design w/ exercise
- Concurrent (& delegated) review





CAPSTONE - MORE ON DELIVERY OPTIONS



- Will continue to offer through PROSPECT, 2-3 times per year
- Can be delivered (same as PROSPECT course) on-demand, on-site at District/ **MSC** offices
 - Host office covers instructor costs
 - St. Paul hosting in 2019
- Could be delivered on-demand, on-site to PDT's – e.g., geared to a particular study
 - Would require some additional investment by instructors to shift from existing case studies to host **District study**

RISK INFORMED DECISION MAKING: NORFOLK DISTRICT WORKSHOP

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Purpose: As multiple new studies are beginning in our District, provide the tools and knowledge to the *entire* PDT to navigate the risk-informed decision making process. In addition, evaluate our recent work to capture positive and negative lessons learned.



Started with RD James "Move Dirt" video – was great opener. Then did an ice breaker activity to ease into the teamwork sessions.

RISK INFORMED DECISION MAKING: NORFOLK DISTRICT WORKSHOP



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- Off-site
- Instructed by CWRPs and Planning Mentor
- Targeted at all Civil Works Employees (especially non-Planners!)
- Recruited the resource Chiefs (Real Estate, H&H, OC)
- Focused on interactive group activities
- Full 2 hour iteration of the planning process using an example
- Used readily available risk slides to create presentation and then tailored to this workshop
- After the workshop, made risk slides available to Planning Mentors

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LESSONS LEARNED: RECURRING THEMES




- Risk informed decision making means different things to different CoPs
- The risk messaging at higher levels is not always consistent across CoPs
- Performing planning iterations very helpful to to learning process
- One must "do" to "learn"
- Confusion remains on intent and functionality of risk register – especially outside of Planning
- Sharing success is important!! When risk informed decisions have provided value, share the good news!

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- Keep pushing!!! At every opportunity, remind your teams to put on their risk hats.
- Don't assume that other team members have the same risk knowledge. Be willing to teach them – change happens from the ground up.
- Use available information reach out to presenters on this webinar and use the already developed material to spread the good word.
- Rapid planning iterations are a great teaching tool and force participants to plow through the process.
- We have ALWAYS done risk informed decision making. We just have better tools to document the risks and are more deliberate about it now.
