Civilian Leadership Education Requirements & Opportunities 9 February 2023 Q&A Session

## Where should interested participants start if they have not completed any of the Intermediate and Advance Leadership Courses for Army Civilians?

Everyone must start with the Foundation course. Once the Foundation course is completed the GS-grade appropriate courses will be opened, which helps determine a participant's path through the program. Those who are eligible to take the Advanced Leadership Course are also welcome to participate in the Intermediate Leadership Course.

It should be noted that the Action Officer course is different from the Foundation course. The Action Officer Development Course, Organizational Leader Development Course, and Manager Development Course are all asynchronous/online-based courses. Interested participants must apply to the Action Officer courses.

## Are there any additional educational opportunities offered through the Army Management Staff College once the Advanced Leadership Course has been completed?

Once the Advanced Leadership Course has been completed, participants can enroll in a Continuing Education for Senior Leaders course. Three courses are available: Strategic Leadership, Business Transformation, and Information Advantage. ## How can interested participants see the course schedules for the year?

All class dates are posted to the <u>Army Training Requirements and Resource System (ATRRS)</u>, but the dates are not visible on <u>the Civilian Human Resources Training Application System (CHRTAS)</u> where participants enroll. Those interested should review upcoming class dates on ATRRS and then enroll via CHRTAS.
