#### WHAT IS THE CHARGE?

- Provides instructions to review team
- Includes review objective and specific advice sought
- Focuses reviewers on details critical to successful project performance
- Prepared by the ATR lead, on behalf of RMO, with PDT input







#### WHY IS THE CHARGE IMPORTANT?

- A clear charge helps the review team focus on most important issues at hand
  - Areas of high risk
  - Critical analyses and assumptions that affect project selection, implementation, or operations
- Gives ATR team direction and sets expectations
- Makes review more efficient
- Saves time and resources















### ATR "CHARGE" GUIDELINES

- Develop charge to include directions for ATR Team
  - ATR Team reviews work products against USACE guidance
  - Project Study Issue Checklist includes many of the more frequent and sensitive policy areas encountered in studies
  - Waivers for deviation from USACE guidance should be obtained before review and highlighted in the charge









- Make sure you understand the review process
- Familiarize yourself with typical "charge" for your business line
- Help the review team understand the unique aspects of your project through the ATR charge.
- Recognize reviewers should verify that information is being used correctly by other disciplines







#### **BEST PRACTICES**

- PDT should work with RMO/ATRT Lead to develop charge
- Start with the standard and customize to project
- Highlight unique considerations (e.g., local laws that may affect project)
- Consider Risk Register/High Risk Items in charge
- Identify any policy waivers and status of approval
